A jigsaw puzzle is a tiling puzzle that requires the assembly of numerous small, often oddly shaped, interlocking and tessellating pieces. Each piece usually has a small part of a picture on it; when complete, a jigsaw puzzle produces a complete picture. From the 1950's it became popular to use photographs and images from TV & Radio programs and other areas of popular culture such as music and cinema.
