In the recent Janet Mendelsohn '68 exhibition at the Ort Gallery, one photo showed a single building alone against a street of rubble, clearly awaiting demolition. The building was unmistakably signed 'KENCHS (chips) Ltd'. No further information was available with the photograph. Research has shown it stood on Gooch St between the River Rea and Hope St. It was gone by the beginning of the 70s. In the times since fish & chip shops has gone from source of everybody's supper to something you're more likely to see on holiday at the seaside. The 1965 Kelly's directory listed 17 chippies in Birmingham 12 and there may have been more that didn't pay for an entry.
