This was followed by a launch for local TV with Carl Chinn at the back to backs that went out on both BBC



and ITV news. The most recent event was part of Birmingham Heritage week with а short parade, a song from the youth theatre, and a talk from Patricia Skidmore. The project worker. Rowena Lyon, has already collected stories from several ex-home children, short versions of which were displayed at the last event.

Restoration.


The rebuilding of the old Art School is almost complete and it should be
