George Robey and his wife, along with the Rev Alfred Doyle, visit the church hall where he made his first public appearance, in 1888, St Mary and St Ambrose, Pershore Road, Edgbaston, 1951. He then went on to open the garden party in aid of church funds. The comedian was knighted in 1954.

BOWENS OF BALSALL HEATH

John Bowen, the illustrious builder from Balsall Heath, is to be commemorated next year by the Civic Society with a blue plaque.

The suggested site for the plaque is on the former Bowen Works in **George Street** which still remains there to this day. Bowen's crowning glory is probably the Victoria Law Courts, which is also being considered as the site for a commemorative plaque.
