

Balsall Heath Local History Society Annual Report 2018-2019







Bringing history to life

The Society was founded about 40 years ago with the aim of promoting interest in our local history. Over the years the Society has achieved considerable success, working with schools and community groups, organising exhibitions and events, collecting resources and producing its own publications. It is important we all feel pride in our area and to value its strengths, both past and present. Local history has a key role to play in underpinning community cohesion.



"The Lost Children"

This year has also seen the development of a new project on the Middlemore Children's Emigration Homes, "The Lost Children", funded by the Heritage Lottery. The Homes took over 6000 children from Birmingham to Canada between 1873 & 1948, to be placed with farmers in the backwoods until 1932 and later than that to Fairbridge Farm School.



We launched the project at the Back to Backs last August and followed this with a public event in September, with Balsall Heath Youth Theatre performing in New Street Station and outside St Martin's. This was followed by a talk by Patricia Skidmore, from Canada, daughter of a Middlemore migrant.

The aims of the project are to raise awareness of the work of the Homes, compile some case studies and make contact with relatives/ descendants living in England. There will be an exhibition at the Birmingham and Midland Institute in September 2019 together with talks and a Dramatic Lecture.

Enquiries and The Gazette Newsletter

Goodbye to the Schoolroom

The Schoolroom in the old Clifton Junior School sadly closed in July 2017 as St Paul's Trust decided the building was no longer safe to use. It moved to Price's Square, Northfield where it looked excellent but in July we had notice to quit. We assessed our options carefully but decided it was time to say goodbye. Almost all the equipment was sold.

Lost & Found!

Lost: In September last year the original building which in the 1980s, was part of the Emigration Homes in St Luke's Road, was demolished as, indeed, was St Luke's Church.





Found: A WW1War memorial from the Moseley Road Congregational Church (no longer there) was found in a skip in Wylde Green. We helped to find its origin.

Also found: a lovely collection of photos taken by Nick Bigg in the 1980s, donated by his sister, following his death in 2018.

Chairman's Report

The Society continued to have guest speakers who dealt with wide and fascinating subjects including Ruth Lowe, staggering us with samples of clothes from her extensive collection designed by Mary Quant whilst at the same time giving us details of her life; Richard Churchley stating that "The Poor are always with us"; Gina Maddison, the girl from Guildford Street, growing up in working class Birmingham in the late 1960's.

Not all meetings have gone according to plan however. Richard Churchley had to cancel an earlier date because of an accident with a hedge cutter (thankfully not too serious) and we had to rearrange Gina Maddison's date because of inclement weather. I would like to commend our Speakers' Secretary, Bron Salway, for dealing with these problems and for continuing to find these excellent guests.

Not all monthly meetings took place at the Venture. In August we were given an enjoyable tour, after hours, of the Walsall Leather Museum.

I would like to thank members of the Committee notably Val Hart, Diane Stead, Margaret Pendry and Pat Johnson for their help in setting up the monthly meetings particularly in taking admission money and supplying refreshments and our Vice-Chair, Jenny Lloyd, for filling in for me most admirably when I was unable to attend.

Finally I must thank you, the members, for attending the monthly meetings and hope that you will continue to do so.
