The Lost Children Project

At the end of February our Heritage Lottery funding comes to an end but this is far from the end of our involvement with the story. The project has been an outstanding success in every way. Over 1000 people visited our exhibitions, over 150 families have contacted us with their stories and more than 50 volunteers have given their time and energy. We are all sad to say goodbye to our Project Officer, Rowena, who has been utterly amazing.

The Middlemore Archives are rich in detailed records of children's lives but the relative's stories have given us a wonderful insight into the impact on whole families on both sides of the Atlantic. Many of the children who were sent to Canada left behind siblings in Birmingham and in some cases it is only now that reconnections are being made.

"The Lost Children", the book which we are publishing, will be available shortly.

Meanwhile we are setting up a Middlemore Group for any relatives and volunteers who wish to stay involved, and we will be continuing in our searches in the archives.



In 2022 Birmingham will be hosting the Commonwealth Games and we are delighted to announce that the Civic Society has authorised a blue

plaque for St Luke's Road, on the site of the original Homes building in Highgate. The builders, Barratts, who have developed the site, officially opened their B5 Central scheme last week and invited us to attend. They are giving full support to the Plaque and are even going to plant some Maple Trees.

Renewal at St. Alban's

St Alban's Parochial Church Council, has received a grant of £222,000 from The National Lottery Heritage Fund. This grant will help the Church Council to: Protect the building by renewing the roof, repairing walls and windows, and providing step-free access for wheelchair users.

This will let them have more public open days, guided tours, concerts and recitals and generally open up to a much wider audience. They also plan to train more volunteers for their open days. The work will start next month.
