


Balsall Heath Local History Society

I also have to thank you, our members, for your continuing interest, which was perfectly illustrated by the numbers who turned up at the two special events. Here's to a more normal and successful year to come.



Enquiries and The Gazette Newsletter

Research queries are steady and are usually connected to family history. The Gazette has flourished this year and expanded, as distribution by email has meant we could spread to more pages. It has a wide circulation and we get a lot of positive feedback. Thank you to all readers who help by responding to enquiries and thanks also to all those who have shared their Balsall Heath memories with us.

The Lost Children Project

The Project aimed to raise awareness of the work of the Middlemore Homes which emigrated over 5000 children from Birmingham, chiefly to Canada, between 1873 & 1948. The children were placed with farmers in the backwoods until 1932 and after that to Fairbridge Farm School.



The funding for this Project has now finished but the work is continuing with the help of many volunteers. The book, "The Lost Children" has been selling well and enquiries from relatives have continued to flow in during the pandemic . We expect to resume research in the Archives in the coming year. Val Hart has given a talk for the British Association for Local History, now on their website.

Plans for the Blue Plaque in St Luke's Road, Highgate, are well advanced with a date set in July 2022 to tie in with the Commonwealth games coming to Birmingham.




